The WFH Twinning Program has built a global network of patient organizations and treatment centres in developing and developed countries.

The WFH helps twins arrange comprehensive care training, exchanges, workshops, patient education, and other activities to improve treatment and care of people with rare bleeding disorders.

Twinning partners benefit from sharing their experience in treating rare bleeding disorders, facing new challenges, and building strong relationships.

Between 2002 and 2007, there have been 92 partnerships in 74 countries.

Twinning Outcomes 2002-2007

115 medical trainings expanded twins' medical and comprehensive care expertise, improving management of rare bleeding disorders in 54 countries.

94 outreach initiatives by patient organizations resulted in new chapters, increased membership, registries of people with rare bleeding disorders, and camps for children, adults, or families.

51 resources enhanced care with the provision of medical supplies, equipment, reagents, educational materials, and 2 million units of clotting factor concentrates.

46 projects improved diagnosis and treatment by developing diagnostic capacity, producing treatment guidelines, or conducting research projects.

22 patient organizations strengthened capacity through lobbying, advocacy, governance, or fundraising training.
